

CONTRACT FOR SECURITY SERVICES

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This contract made and entered into at Quezon City, Philippines by and between:

The **BUREAU OF BROADCAST SERVICES**, a government agency duly organized under Philippine laws with principal office address at 4th Floor Media Center (PIA) Building, Visayas Avenue, Quezon City, Philippines, represented herein by its Director, **RIZAL GIOVANNI P. APORTADERA, JR.**, hereinafter referred to as **BBS**.

- and -

The **168 SECURITY INC.** organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, holding its office at Room 2B, 2nd Floor, Hizon Building #29 Quezon Avenue, Quezon City, represented herein by **CATHERINE T. MARQUEZ**, Licensee, hereinafter referred to as the **AGENCY**.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Broadcast Services needs the services of a security agency to render security services for BBS radio stations, offices, studios, transmitter plants mentioned in Annex A hereof;

WHEREAS, in a public bidding conducted for the purpose, AGENCY was declared as having the single calculated/rated responsive bid by the Bureau of Broadcast Services Bids and Awards Committee (BAC), which shall form part of this contract in addition to the following: Invitation to Bid, Bid Form including all documents statements contained in the two bidding envelopes, pre-qualification documents, BAC Resolution No.311 series of 2018, Performance Security and Notice of Award;

WHEREAS, Bureau of Broadcast Services accepted said offer of AGENCY;

NOW, THEREFORE, in view of the foregoing premises and of the mutual covenants and stipulations hereinafter provided the parties hereto have agreed as follows:

ARTICLE I SCOPE OF SECURITY WORK

1. AGENCY shall provide and make available the necessary number of qualified, acceptable, licensed, bonded, armed and uniformed security guards on a 24-hour daily coverage for BBS aforementioned radio stations and/or office(s), as mentioned in the attached DEPLOYMENT OF GUARDS hereto attached Annex "B" for the purpose of ensuring its security and safety, including BBS properties deposited and stored therein, as well as the persons and properties of the employees of the BBS against losses and damages due to and/or caused by theft, pilferage, robbery, and other unlawful acts of strangers and/or third parties.
2. AGENCY shall provide the appropriate number of guards for two (2) shifts a day or one shift of 12 hours a day as the requirement may be. The regular daily tour of duty for each guard shall be twelve (12) hours, and no guard shall be made to render more than twelve (12) hour duty within a 24-hour period except in cases of extreme necessity and only upon prior written permission of BBS.
3. AGENCY shall be liable for any loss, injury or damage to life and/or property within the BBS premises and all the contents thereof mentioned in the Article II hereof when such could have been avoided/prevented had the AGENCY guard(s) not been negligent and/or remiss in the performance of the assigned duties and responsibilities; provided that such loss, injury or damage shall be reported in writing by BBS to the AGENCY through any of guards assigned with BBS

within forty-eight (48) hours from the time of discovery of such loss, injury or damage and results of the investigation disclosed that AGENCY guards are negligent and/remiss in the performance of assigned duties.

4. AGENCY shall also, at all times, extend security and protection to BBS personnel and authorized visitors and their personal properties within BBS premises.

ARTICLE II PAYMENT

1. For and in consideration of the security services to be rendered by the AGENCY to BBS, the BBS shall, during the term of the contract, pay the AGENCY the amount of **EIGHTEEN MILLION NINE HUNDRED SEVENTEEN THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED NINETY TWO PESOS and 28/100 CENTAVOS (Php 18,917,492.28)** for the period January 01, 2019 – December 31, 2019 on the basis of twelve (12) working hours a day, Sundays and Holidays included, inclusive of Value Added Tax (VAT), subject to adjustments if found not in accordance with auditing and accounting rules.
2. BBS shall pay AGENCY based on the latter's actual performance of the services called for under this Contract taking into account the actual number of personnel, their actual tour of duty and respective compensations per month as listed in Annex "C" hereof, and deductions for penalties under Article VIII hereof. It is understood that Agency's billing include all the statutory compensation and benefits due to its security guards as provided for under but not limited to the Minimum Wage Law, Executive Order no. 178 and Republic Act No. 6640.
3. BBS shall, the right to audit over the payroll of AGENCY and send its duly authorized representative to oversee the payment of wages to the security guards assigned with BBS.

ARTICLE III MANNER OF PAYMENT

1. Payment shall be made every fifteen (15) days of the month for security services rendered per billing submitted by AGENCY. The bill of AGENCY shall be supported by a properly accomplished payroll showing the gross amount earned deductions and the net amounts payable to the security guards and properly signed daily time records. Where Bundy clock is available, accomplished time cards shall be submitted. The number of security guards considered for billing purposes shall not exceed those listed in the duly approved guard deployment roster covering the billing period. Deductions from billings shall be imposed as provided for in Article VII hereof.

There shall be accomplished two (2) copies Daily Time Records (DTR) duly approved by the BBS responsible Officer, one of which will be retained by BBS. Billings must be submitted by the AGENCY not later than ten (10) days after the lapse of each fifteen (15) day billing period as proof that AGENCY is concerned with maintaining its liquidity to pay the Security Guard's salaries on time.

2. AGENCY hereby binds itself to pay its employees in accordance with the provisions which may arise under existing laws and shall comply with the provisions of all other Philippine Laws relative to its employees.
3. For information purposes. AGENCY shall have every end of the month, submit to BBS reports and/or information concerning illness and/or accident occurring or befalling its employees assigned to the premises of BBS; if BBS becomes liable to any employee of the AGENCY under the provisions of any law resulting from AGENCY'S failure to comply with said law, AGENCY shall reimburse BBS for all payments made to said employee. The performance bond filed by AGENCY shall also answer for this contingency, including attorney's fees and cost of suit. AGENCY shall, together with its billings, submit to BBS a sworn statement certifying that it has paid the salaries, wages and/or benefits due to its guards under the law for the billing period.

**ARTICLE IV
OBLIGATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF AGENCY**

1. It is expressly understood and agreed that for all legal intents and purposes, all the guards of AGENCY employed under this Contract shall **not** be considered employees of BBS. Security AGENCY assumes full responsibility for the faithful and complete performance by the security guards of all their duties pursuant to the provisions of this Contract.
2. AGENCY shall ensure and guarantee that its security guards shall familiarize themselves with BBS officers and all the network's personnel, and at all time, accord them the highest respect and courtesy.
3. AGENCY shall submit promptly a report of all incidents of loss, injury or damage to life and property involving BBS properties and personnel immediately but not later than the following day after their occurrence.
4. AGENCY shall provide each guard its appropriate AGENCY owned and licensed firearms and ammunitions as required in this Contract or that which may be required by BBS in the future as required by the situation, during his tour of duty, including but not limited to office and transportation equipment and such other accessories or related equipment, tools, supplies and materials for the use, service and control of the security force under this Contract.
5. AGENCY shall exercise effective administration, control, supervision and inspection through its Supervising Security Officer to prevent any violation, commission and other anomalous acts of the guards on duty and that in the performance of their duties, and that all accidents or occurrences to and/or all persons within the serviced area shall be the sole responsibility of AGENCY. However, AGENCY shall not implement any action affecting the guards or services without the prior knowledge, concurrence and/or approval of the BBS Director
6. AGENCY shall provide for free one (1) set of uniform and one (1) pair of shoes to each guard at the start of this Contract or in accordance with PADPAO rules and regulations whichever is convenient to the guards.
7. AGENCY hereby guarantees that all guards shall follow all regulations, policies and security programs and plans of BBS to continuously improve their performance, efficiency, discipline, fitness and preparedness, and warrants that all security guards shall observe the highest courtesy and respect towards all officials and employees of BBS including authorized visitors in the execution of their duties.
8. AGENCY shall provide BBS with the number of guards as stated in Annex "A" hereof, and any decrease or increase in the number of guards without the written approval of the BBS Director shall be a sufficient ground for the termination of this Contract.
9. AGENCY shall diligently and faithfully serve the best interest of BBS in rendering its services and shall not during the period of this Contract or at any given time thereafter, use or disclose to any unauthorized person, firm or entity, any information concerning the business affairs of BBS which the members of the security force of AGENCY may have acquired by reasons of such contractual relationship.
10. AGENCY hereby guarantees that the salaries of the guards detailed with BBS shall be paid on time and exactly reflected in the payroll submitted to the BBS for reimbursement. Any repetitive and unjustified delays in the payment of the salaries attributable mainly to the AGENCY, or if the guards are not paid the exact amount due to them as reflected in the payroll, shall be sufficient ground for the BBS to undertake direct payment scheme or terminate the service contract.
11. AGENCY shall guarantee that all the employer's share for the AGENCY, like the SSS premiums, ECC, Medicare and others and the corresponding employees shares being pre-deducted, are all remitted properly and on time to the concerned agencies and any unjustified delay or non-remittance of these amounts shall be a sufficient ground for BBS to remit those amounts directly to the concerned government agencies.

12. AGENCY shall employ experienced, licensed, uniformed and armed guards who shall meet the following qualifications:
 - a. Physically fit as per BBS fitness standard; Height: 5'5" or over, minimum normal weight corresponding to weight to height (for 5'5 – 120 lbs; age – between 21 and 45 years old for male and between 25 and 40 years old for female;
 - b. Not related to any BBS personnel in the area, office or radio station being serviced within the fourth degree of consanguinity and affinity;
 - c. Of good moral character, sound mind and without criminal or police record. Must have clearance from the local police, the National Bureau of Investigation, and Certificate from a neuro-psychiatrist duly-accredited by the Philippine National Police;
 - d. Possess the qualifications as prescribed in Section 5 Republic Act No. 5487, as amended by PD Nos. 11 and 11-A.

13. AGENCY guards and personnel shall be under the Agency with respect to deployment, work shifts and execution of security plans, in consultation with the BBS Director or his designated representative.

14. The AGENCY shall provide all of the following services, including additional services, if any specified in Section VI: Schedule of Requirements:
 - a. One (1) Handheld Metal Detector at the Central Office;
 - b. Minimum of eight (8) handheld two-way radios at the Central Office (4), Marulas Transmitter Site (2) and Malolos Transmitter Site (2);
 - c. Two sets 6-Unit + DVR CCTV Cameras to be installed at the Central Office, and of which shall be turned over to BBS upon completion of the contract;
 - d. One set 6-Unit + DVR CCTV Cameras to be installed at the Marulas Transmitter Site, and of which shall be turned over to BBS upon completion of the contract;
 - e. One set 6-Unit + DVR CCTV Cameras to be installed at the Malolos Transmitter Site, and of which shall be turned over to BBS upon completion of the contract;
 - f. Vehicle inspection mirror;
 - g. All security guards on duty should be armed with at least one (1) 9mm pistol; and
 - h. To provide one (1) 12 – gauge shotgun to security guard on duty in Marulas Transmitter Site and one (1) 12 –gauge shotgun to security guard on duty in Malolos Transmitter Site.

**ARTICLE V
PERFORMANCE/SURETY BOND**

1. AGENCY shall at the time of the signing of the Contract, file a performance bond (penal bond) in any of the following forms: cash, manager's/cashier's check, bank draft/guarantee, or irrevocable letter of credit, issued by a Universal or Commercial Bank in the amount equivalent to five percent (5%) of the total contract price or surety bond equivalent to five percent (5%) of the total contract price for a term or effective period of ten (10) days more than the duration of this Contract, to guarantee the faithful and satisfactory fulfillment of all the Agency's obligations under this Contract.

2. This bond shall entirely be forfeited in favor of BBS upon default of AGENCY and shall be answerable for any and all damages and losses that may be suffered by BBS as a result of the failure of AGENCY to perform any of its obligations under this Contract. BBS shall release this bond at the expiration or termination of this Contract provided that there are no pending claims filed against the Security AGENCY and/or the Surety Company.

**ARTICLE VI
RIGHTS OF BBS**

1. The BBS Director or his authorized representative shall conduct inspection in rank/formation of guards and firearms upon the initial assumption of the contracted services before posting, and at least once every month thereafter.
2. BBS officials with line/functional authority shall have the right to inspect the guards at any time to ensure the proper security of the personnel, materials and equipment within the BBS AGENCY from full responsibility for any inadequate security and protection of its personnel premises and the contents thereof.
3. It is the obligation of BBS to impose disciplinary sanctions for any violation committed by the AGENCY guard during his tour of duty or off duty, inside the premises covered by the service contract. Any such violation, which comes to the attention of the BBS first, shall be reported by the same in writing to the AGENCY for appropriate action.
4. BBS shall have the right to increase or decrease the number of guards as the necessity for the same arises. AGENCY shall correspondingly increase or decrease the number of guards within twenty-four (24) hours from receipt of a written notice to that effect from BBS and AGENCY shall submit to the BBS Director within the first five (5) days of each month the updated list of guards so assigned, indicating the installation, name and residence number, SSS number, tax account number, disposition and the schedule.
5. If the need arises, BBS shall inform AGENCY in writing that a contracted guard is, in its findings and/or opinion, such AGENCY guard shall be relieved by AGENCY in twenty-four (24) hours if within Central Office and the Malolos and Marulas Transmitting Plants; three (3) days if the location is in Luzon excluding the three (3) afore-cited sites; within five (5) days if the location is in Visayas and Mindanao, for any reason which it deems necessary to protect its interest, BBS shall request in writing the revamp of the entire security force, the same shall be effected without additional cost on the part of BBS.
6. The BBS Director shall have the right to ask for reassignment of the AGENCY's individual guards to any BBS offices or stations.
7. BBS shall have access to records of payment of salaries and/or auditorial right over the payroll of the Security Agency.
8. BBS shall deduct the penalties for absences and tardiness of the security guards and other violations of the guards and the AGENCY from the AGENCY's monthly billings as provided in Article VIII hereof.



**ARTICLE VII
PENALTIES FOR OFFENSES OR VIOLATION OF RULES**

1. The BBS Director shall impose on AGENCY penalties for violations of this Contract committed by the AGENCY as listed below:

2. The BBS Director shall impose on AGENCY penalties for offenses or violations as listed below, Without prejudice to penalties as may be imposed by the Director General, Philippine National Police as provided for in Sections 2 and 3 of P.D. 1919 and to the disciplinary sanctions that may be imposed on the individual erring guard by BBS.
- a. Abandonment of Post.
 - b. Security guards smoking while on duty.
 - c. Security guards reading newspapers, comics and other unofficial reading materials while on duty.

- d. Security guards with non-regulation haircut, wearing of beard/moustache or in improper uniform.
- e. Security guards on prolonged or unnecessary conversation with visitors/employees while on duty.
- f. Security guard without whistle, night stick, flashlight while on duty, raincoat while raining.
- g. Reporting late for duty or formation and absent without due notice.

Penalty of the afore-mentioned offenses shall be deducted from the billing of P100.00 per incident and removal of the guard from BBS service upon receipt of a written notice.

- 3. BBS in its desire to instill discipline improve fitness and professionalism among the security guards may formulate and implement a system of reward and punishment supplementing and/or independent of the offenses and penalties provided in this Article.
- 4. The BBS Director shall inform the Security AGENCY of any offense or violation of rules, name of guard apprehended, time and date of apprehension. Apprehension reports shall be signed by apprehended party and apprehending party.

**ARTICLE VIII
RIGHT OF BBS TO TERMINATE CONTRACT**

- 1. It is expressly understood herein that the relationship of AGENCY with BBS is based purely on the trust and confidence of the latter in the former, and that BBS shall have the exclusive right to terminate the Contract in case of loss of said trust and confidence in AGENCY , upon thirty (30)-day prior written notice thereof to the AGENCY.

BBS shall have the right to terminate the Contract, after a five (5)-day written notice thereof of the AGENCY on the following grounds:

- a. When AGENCY guard has willfully and intentionally or through negligence causes the death of or has inflicted serious physical injury on any person except criminal resisting arrest, inside BBS premises or any BBS personnel while on official duty inside the installation.
- b. When AGENCY guard has willfully and intentionally or through negligence causes irreparable damage to the prestige or any interest of BBS or has caused destruction of BBS properties and equipment or has caused economic loss by personal participation or non-performance of his duties and responsibilities.

- c. When AGENCY guard has personally or through other person threatened the life of any personnel or the security and safety of any installation or properties of BBS or has willfully and intentionally endangered the security and safety of the stations and personnel of the latter.
- d. When AGENCY has violated other obligations required under this Contract and refused to comply and/or remedy the violation within the reasonable period given by BBS.

2. BBS has the right to impose penalties on the guard/s for the following offense, if found guilty:

**ARTICLE IX
WARRANTY CLAUSE**

1. The AGENCY hereby warrants that it or its representative has not offered paid, directly or indirectly, any government officer and BBS official or employee any consideration or commission for the contract nor has it or its representative exerted or utilized any corrupt or unlawful influence to secure or solicit this contract for any consideration or commission; that the AGENCY will not subcontract any portion or portions of the scope of the work of the Contract awarded to him or any official or employee of BBS officials who are directly and/or indirectly involved in the contract awards or project prosecution; and that if any commission is being paid to a private person, he shall disclose the name of said person amount being paid; and that any violation of this warranty shall be ground for the rescission or cancellation of this Contract or the reduction from the contract price of the consideration or commission paid without prejudice to the filing of civil or criminal action under the Anti-Graft Law and other applicable laws against the AGENCY and/or his representative and BBS official/employee.

**ARTICLE X
VALIDITY CLAUSE**

1. If any term or condition of this Contract is held invalid or contrary to law, the validity of the other terms and conditions hereof shall not be affected by thereby.

**ARTICLE XI
VENUE OF ACTION AND COURT LITIGATION**

1. The parties hereto hereby agree that the venue action for any cause or causes of action, which may arise from this Contract, shall be exclusive in the proper court of Quezon City, Philippines only. In case of Court litigation arising out of any violation of the terms and conditions of this Contract by AGENCY, or any cause arising there from, the amount of twenty percent (20%) of the value of the award made the Court shall be paid by AGENCY to BBS by way of attorney's

fees and other expenses of litigation but in no case shall such amount for attorney's fees and other expenses of litigation be less than **FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS (PHp 50,000.00)**.

**ARTICLE XII
DURATION**

1. This Contract shall take effect on January 01, 2019 to December 31, 2019 unless otherwise cancelled and/or terminated by BBS upon serving thirty (30) days advance written notice to the Agency of its intention to terminate the Contract; provided the security Agency may terminate the Contract only upon reasonable ground and with prior written approval of and upon serving thirty (30) days advance written notice to BBS provided, further, that in the event the license to operate of AGENCY is cancelled by the PNP then this Contract shall automatically cease to operate without need of serving the thirty (30) days advance written notice.

In case, BBS failed to bid for security services after the lapse of the period of this Contract for justifiable reasons, BBS may opt to renew its Contract with the AGENCY on a monthly basis;


